
var. hevronii

Dwarf, evergreen, perennial, mat-forming herb less than 1.5 cm high, 2-16 cm in diameter



Fabaceae (Pea Family)

Phenology: flowering late April to May, fruiting May to June.

Management Responsibility: Navajo Nation.

Similar Species: distinguished from var. cremnophylax by its larger flower and var. myriorrhaphis by lack of spinescent leaf bases and from A. calycosus by unilocular fruit and smaller leaflets.

Notes: this variety is endemic to the rim of Marble Canyon; in 1997, six

sites with about 265 plants were located.



Astragalus cremnophylax var. hevronii

Habitat: rimrock benches at the canyon edge in crevices and depressions with shallow soils on Kaibab Limestone; **Great Basin** desertscrub habitat at 5,420 ft (1650 m) elevation.





Range: known only from the east rim of Marble Canyon.
