

Phenology: flowering March to April; plants retract into the soil in response to drought.

Management Responsibility: BLM (AZ Strip Field Office), NPS (Glen Canyon NRA), Navajo Nation, AZ Dept of Transportation.

Synonyms: Toumeya bradyi (L.D. Benson) W. Earle

Similar Species: can be mistaken with juveniles of Coryphantha vivipara

Notes: *P. bradyi* is a narrow endemic with very specific soil requirements.

Habitat: grows on Kaibab L)imestone chips overlaying soils derived from Moenkopi Formation, 3,340 to 5,200 ft (1018-1585 m) elevation.





Range: only known from Marble Canyon vicinity.
