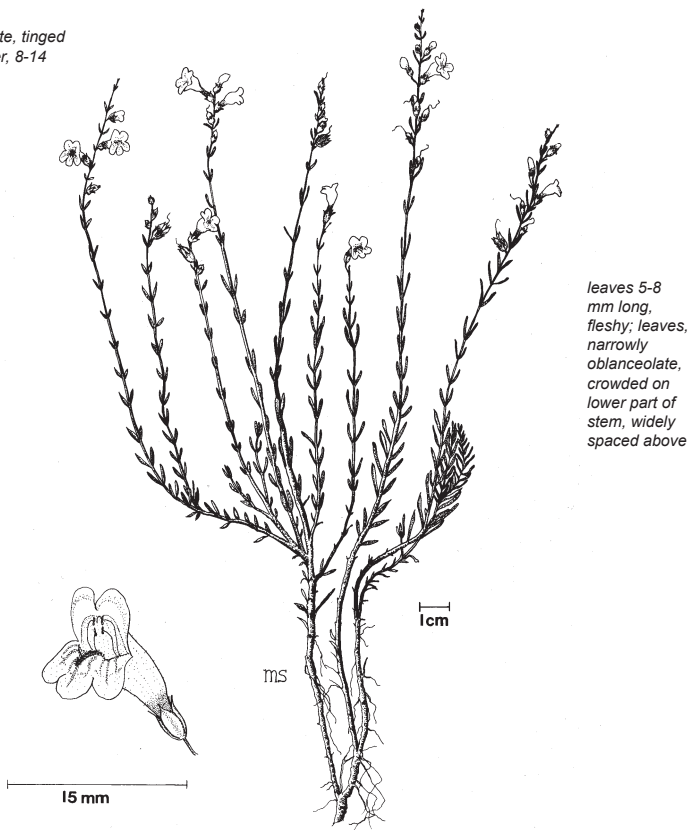


Small woody shrub, 19-35 cm  
tall, rooted in bedrock

flower is white, tinged  
with lavender, 8-14  
mm long



leaves 5-8  
mm long,  
fleshy; leaves,  
narrowly  
oblanceolate,  
crowded on  
lower part of  
stem, widely  
spaced above

### *Scrophulariaceae (Snapdragon Family)*

**Phenology:** flowers in June-July, fruiting in August.

**Management Responsibility:** USFS (Coronado NF), BLM (Safford Field Office).

**Notes:** some populations threatened by rock climbers. Monitored population in the Santa Catalinas has been stable

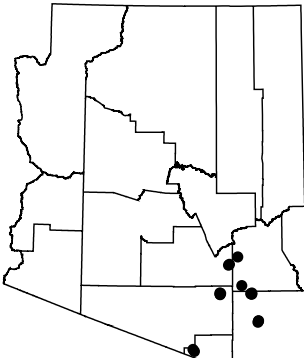
*Penstemon discolor*

**Habitat:** bedrock openings in chaparral or pine-oak woodland at 4,400-7,200 ft (1340-2200 m) elevation. Plants rooted in rock cracks or thin soil pockets on granite bedrock or outcroppings of whitish volcanic tuff.
