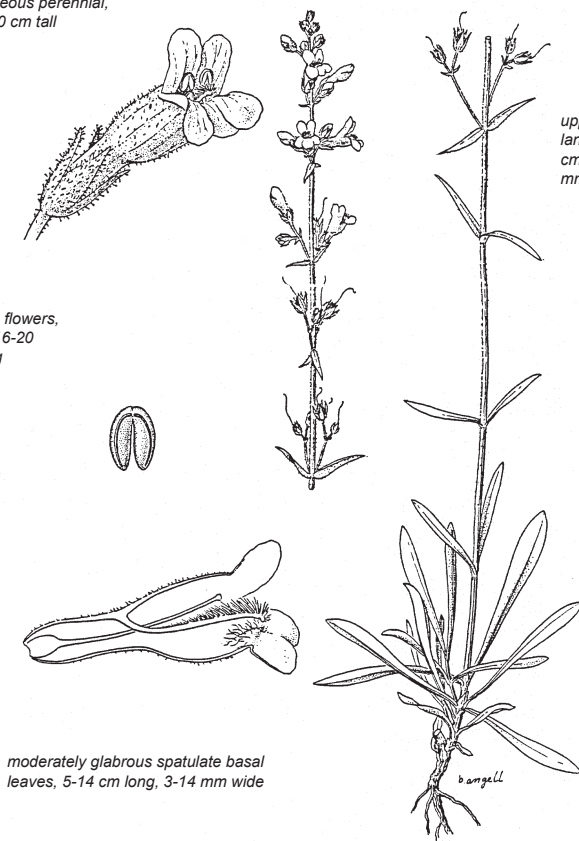


Herbaceous perennial,
up to 60 cm tall

sky blue flowers,
corolla 16-20
mm long

upper leaves
lanceolate, 2.5-5
cm long and 1-3
mm wide



moderately glabrous spatulate basal
leaves, 5-14 cm long, 3-14 mm wide

Scrophulariaceae (Snapdragon Family)

Phenology: flowering May; fruiting May to June.

Management Responsibility: BLM (AZ Strip Field Office).

Notes: locally common but highly restricted; impacted by rabbit herbivory. BLM monitoring 1987-1998 indicates mostly stable to upward trend.

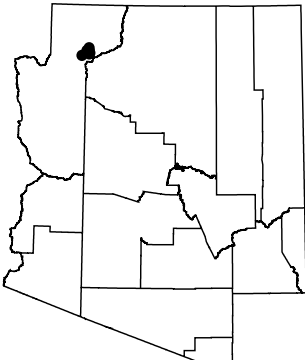

Penstemon distans

Habitat: typically in gravelly Kaibab limestone on mesa tops in pinyon-juniper woodlands, but also known from steep north facing canyon slopes of Supai Formation in Mohave desertscrub, 3,900 to 5,200 ft (1190-1585 m) elevation.
