

## Anacardiaceae (Cashew/Sumac Family)

Phenology: flowers January to February.

**Management Responsibility:** DoD-USAF (Barry M. Goldwater Gunnery Range).

**Similar Species:** differs from *Rhus ovata* by its flat oblong or oval leaves, conspicuous venation, shorter petioles, and lower elevation; differs from *R. integrifolia* by its more sparse, less appressed pubescence, leaves with entire margins, conspicuous venation, non-glandular hairs on sepal margins, petals without marginal hairs.

Habitat: northfacing dry cliffs in desert scrub, 1,000-1,500 ft (300-450 m) elevation.







Range: only known from a few mountain ranges in southern Yuma County and northwestern Mexico.
