
Arizona Willow Salix arizonica



Phenology: flowers May to June; plants reproduce vegetatively, making it difficult to determine if sexual reproduction is occurring.

Management Responsibility: USFS (Apache-Sitgreaves NF), White Mountain Apache Tribe.

Notes: population trends have been improving as a result of more conservation-oriented management practices; a conservation strategy, assessment and agreement is being implemented. Under stressed habitat conditions often has a rust disease outbreak in clonal population.

Habitat: species occurs in high elevation wetland areas (primarily streamside and cienega), 8,500-10,000 ft (2800-3300 m) elevation.
