

Phenology: flowers and sets fruit in September and October.

Management Responsibility: USFS (Coronado NF).

Synonym: *Senecio multidentatus* Schultz-Bip. ex Hemsl. var. *huachucanus* (Gray) T.M. Barkley.

Notes: populations in the Santa Ritas and Huachucas monitored regularly since 1991. Population trend is stable, with both populations exhibiting high reproduction and recruitment. New population discovered in the Chiricahuas (1997).


Senecio huachucanus



Habitat: moist loam soils associated with granite rock outcroppings and/or stabilized talus. Usually found on north-facing shaded slopes at elevations of 7,000-9,500 ft (2100-3000 m). Associated overstory species are: ponderosa pine, douglas fir, quaking aspen and gambel's oak.
