
## BURRO CREEK CLIFFROSE



Rosaceae (Rose Family)

**Phenology:** flowering April to May, fruiting May to June.

**Management Responsibility:** San Carlos Apache Indian Nation, AZ State Land Dept, BLM (Kingman Field Office), USFS (Coconino NF, Tonto NF).

**Synonyms:** Cowania subintegra Kearney, Purshia pinkavae (Schaack)

**Similar Species:** Purshia stansburiana is a tall, erect shrub up to 7.6 m in height and has hairless, glandular leaves that are usually 3-5 lobed, and young twigs are glandular-sticky and are red, not tomentose.

**Notes:** *P. stansburiana* is sympatric with *P. subintegra* in the Verde Valley, where some introgression may be occurring.

## Purshia subintegra



Habitat: rolling limestone hills within Sonoran desertscrub usually on white Tertiary (Miocene and Pliocene) limestone lakebed deposits high in lithium, nitrates, and magnesium, 2,500-4,000 ft (762-1220 m) elevation.
