Announcing the Botany 2025 Conference

The Arizona Native Plant Society will hold its annual Botany Conference March 1 – 2, 2025. The conference venue will be the famous and spectacular Desert Botanical Garden in Phoenix.

On Saturday, March 1, several guided field trips will be offered to local areas of botanical interest. Also, a special "behind the scenes" tour will be offered to view newly completed facilities in the gardens.

The conference agenda will include oral and poster presentations from 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM on Sunday, March 2. A continental breakfast will be offered from 8:30 to 9:00 AM on Sunday with a catered lunch at noon. An optional evening meal and program will also be offered on Sunday following the conference.

The conference committee is currently developing ideas for a conference theme and lining up potential speakers. Specific details about the conference agenda and registration information will be made available soon on the AZNPS website and through direct communications to chapters and individual members.

As 2024 concludes, a review of the year wouldn't be complete without highlighting some of the projects that society members have contributed to through donations, annual dues, and—most importantly—hands-on participation.

- Hosting Boy Scout Eagle work on habitat restoration projects.
- Encouraging city and county agencies to undertake buffel grass and stinkweed eradication programs.
- Enhancing the Waterman Restoration Site, located in the Ironwood National Monument, a twelve-year, ongoing project with the Bureau of Land Management and other partners.
- Working with the AZ Department of Transportation to coordinate invasive species eradication along state highways.
- Sponsoring the Plant Atlas Project of Arizona (PAPAZ) programs to provide botanical training, encourage native plant collecting and inventory work in under-collected regions of the state.
- Establishing working relationships with Arizona Land and Water Trust, Friends of the Madera Canyon.
- Offering two-day grass identification workshops at the UA Herbarium
- Sponsoring the annual Arizona Botany Meetings (2024 meeting held August 17-18, 2024, at Pima College in Tucson). The 2025 Meeting will be held on March 2, 2025, at the Desert Botanic Garden, Phoenix.
- Continuing major buffel grass eradication project at "A" Mountain, Tucson.
- Leading local field trips and chapter meetings.

Join us for a 10-mile roundtrip adventure to explore the plant diversity in a chain-fruit cholla forest, desert ridge, and riparian area. This driving tour will include three stops and minimal walking.

Directions: From Highway 188 in Tonto Basin, turn east on E Tonto Creek Bridge Rd. After crossing the new bridge, continue straight on FS Rd 71/Greenback Valley Rd. The road turns to gravel at 1.3 miles from Highway 188. Continue on the gravel road for 2.2 miles. Turn right into large parking area. You do not need high-clearance or 4-wheel drive. Carpooling will be encouraged at our first stop.
